

Locker Room Monitoring Plan

GSC's monitoring of locker rooms will involve keeping the main entrance doors open (because adequate privacy is retained) and occasional sweeps by staff.

Parents/legal guardians are discouraged from entering the locker rooms during times when they are in use by our athletes. Entry into locker rooms by coaches during use by athletes is restricted to monitoring sweeps and emergencies.

At the O'Connell Center, parents and coaches should use other bathroom facilities in the building. At the City of Gainesville pools, we do not have a restroom option for parents and coaches other than the locker rooms; parents and coaches should avoid being in the locker rooms while in use by athletes (so especially before and after practice).

At the City of Gainesville pools, the general public also has access to locker rooms while GSC is at practice. At the O'Connell Center, recreational swimmers will have access to locker rooms at end of GSC practices when pool use switches over to recreational swim.

Athletes have 15 minutes after practice to shower/change after practice. No loitering or horseplay/physical contact between athletes is allowed.

ANY use of recording-capable devices (phones, cameras, etc.) in locker rooms is strictly prohibited by GSC and by the facilities at which GSC practices. Swimmers and parents are regularly reminded of this, and permanent signs are posted in the locker rooms at the pools GSC uses.

Misconduct and/or violation of GSC locker room policy is to be reported to a group coach and/or the head coach and team administration. Meetings with violators and parents will be arranged as necessary to address behavior issues, and consequences such as suspension from the team will be implemented as needed.
